The student trip to Guatemala on March 8-16 with Dr. T. Bob Davis and other CDS mentors is full with 57 American participants and a number of Guatemalan dental students planning on treating 1,000 patients in 25 dental chairs. Praise the Lord! Dr. Dylan Patrick, a pediatric dentist, is planning on providing operating room treatment to children who cannot be reasonably treated by the Guatemalan team during the week following. He is bringing two other pediatric dentists, an anesthetist, and his whole team. Dr. Blake Westra, a CDS Board Member from Illinois, just took his dental team to work in the Guatemalan dental clinic. The Iowa dental school is planning on leading a student trip to Guatemala in July using the clinic that CDS members have set up there.

The CDS will also be exhibiting at the Global Dental Missions conference in Irving, CA on June 28-29, the Star of the South conference in Houston on July 26-27, the International College of Dentists conference in Nashville on Sept 6-7, the ADA meeting in New Orleans on October 17-19, and the Greater New York meeting in New York City on Dec 1-4.

Many of the major dental conferences at which the CDS participates provide the CDS with a free, complimentary exhibit booth. The CDS is extremely grateful for their support as we are a non-profit organization encouraging, assisting, and equipping dental humanitarian volunteerism. With conference support of the CDS mission, by waving

expensive exhibit fees, the CDS is able to exhibit at these very productive conferences. Over the last several years some conferences have starting charging reduced fees for complimentary exhibit booths to offset costs. The CDS thanks Dr. Tom Love, who has helped the CDS offset these fees which ranges from \$150 to \$500 at numerous conferences. A couple of conferences like the Chicago Midwinter and the AGD charge a high fee to exhibit and the CDS is not participating with an exhibit booth at those conferences at this time.

The Greater New York Meeting (GNYDM) started charging \$1,000 for a complimentary exhibit booth which CDS wants to attend in December. The CDS felt that this fee was too high for a non-profit organization that does not raise money to support exhibit fees. The CDS asked if this booth fee could be reduced, thus showing GNYDM's support of dental humanitarian volunteerism and, hopefully, working as a recruiting tool for the conference. An agreement was worked out between the CDS and GNYDM. It was decided that if the CDS would mention in their News-Briefs and at other conferences about the GNYDM support for the CDS mission, this would suffice for the provision of a free booth at the GNYDM, which is the largest, most international dental conference in the nation with over 50,000 attendees. The amazing exhibit booth displays at the GNYDM generally overshadow any exhibit hall in the nation in size and diversity. New York City is also a fascinating city worth visiting.

The CDS is extremely grateful for the generosity of the GNYDM in providing CDS with a free, complimentary booth in 2024 along with the Rocky Mountain conference in Denver, the Yankee meeting in Boston, the Hinman meeting in Atlanta, the Oregon meeting in Portland, the Pacific meeting in Seattle, and the ADA meeting in New Orleans.
