The CDS thanks Dr. Becky Prescott's family of six (young adults ages 15, 12, 10) who recently returned from their first dental mission trip to Cameroon, Africa, hosted by Bread for Life, www.breadforlife.org.

The CDS helped with the patient chair, stool, dental unit, instruments, sterilization system, technical assistance, and encouragement. Dr. Becky put together a portable dental set-up and

transported it so many Cameroonians received consultations and dental treatment for the first time in their life. The Christian outreach started at the customs consultant in Yaounde and concluded in Dimako at Beulahland agricultural ministry. While at the farm, Bread for Life staff received dental care from Dr. Becky's team, pineapples were planted, and crops prayed for at the Baka pygmy village.

Dr. Becky reported, "The four kids did great and they all returned home healthy and happy. Two of my children are adopted and it was very neat to take them to a place where the majority of people were not white! It was an amazing time of building relationships and helping people."

As with any memorable trip, glitches did not discourage or prevent this brave family from following God's leading to serve. The devil never wants Christians to use dentistry or anything else to further the Gospel message. One example occurred when Delta changed the plane tickets, making it almost impossible to go on the mission. In answer to prayer, United came through with great tickets which saved them \$1500. Visas came through and all fell into place. Seven hours of jet lag and 30 hours of travel each way became an adventure to be talked about, but did not prove to be an obstacle. A power surge burned out the ultrasonic and the generator brought by the missionaries was only 1.5 KW, which was too small to run the dental operating unit or the heating element for the sterilizer out in the bush. Many instruments and supplies were taken. These were all relatively easy fixes and just motivated the Prescott family to "more effectively provide dental care" as they plan to return to Cameroon this coming Summer.

Mother Teresa said, "We can do not great thing, only small things with great love." And Edward Everett Hale said, "I am only one, but I am one. I cannot do everything, but I can do something. And I will not let what I cannot do interfere with what I can do."

May God bless Dr. Becky and the Prescott family. May their example of service to our Lord be an encouragement for others to step out of their comfort zones to serve others in Jesus' name.
